


The Children's House Montessori School

CLASS REPORT

We wish to welcome Charlie Shiroma, Jay Zhao, Christina Marioulas, Audriana Kurniawan, Leo McCullough, Lucas Miller and Zavier Aman and their families to our school. They are learning the classroom routines and settling in well

The three year olds have been looking at the farm animals, reading books on the subject and making craft each week, relating to the animals they have learnt about. The craft activities have given them the opportunity to practice their fine motor skills. They have also done art and craft work highlighting a colour each week.

The four year olds are learning all about the human body. They have explored the five senses gaining some understanding of their senses. They have had opportunities to physically experience the senses tables set up in the classroom, each table highlighting a different sense. They have also started a book on the human body, naming the parts of the body.

The kindergarten children are studying about land and water forms. They have completed a book on land and water forms. They have gained a sound knowledge about many land forms being able to identify an island and a lake with ease.

The kindergarten children have started a world book. They learn about a country each week-starting with Australia and following the alphabetical order. With this study, the children learn about the language spoken in the country, the currency used, its population, the neighbouring countries and the

climate, the significance of their flag and also places of interest. They have also begun a flag book. Children develop researching and investigating skills as they find background information regarding the flag which country it belongs to and its exact location within the continent.

The kindergarten children have been studying about the famous artists. They re-created a Monet art work by painting the water and adding lily pads and water lilies to complete it. They have also studied about Ken Done, an Australian artist drawing their own beach scene with pastels and adding sand to represent the beach. They have also looked at art work from other famous artists such as Margaret Preston and Frederick Remington.

The kindergarten children have been on an excursion to the Sydney Aquarium as part of their study about things that live in water. As it was the first time most students had visited the Aquarium, the excitement was infectious.



They went on the boat looking at the penguins, which was the most exciting part as they had the opportunity to watch the penguins from a touching distance. We watched the sharks swimming swiftly, the manta rays gliding above us, dugongs moving around and many other colourful and ugly looking fish. We also had the opportunity to touch the star fish, sea urchins and shark eggs at the touch pool. The children made us proud by listening to instructions and behaving well.



Easter has come and gone. The children completed many Easter art and craft work before the Easter break. They made cards, Easter baskets and completed many other fun activities. The children decorated their won hats which they wore for the Easter hat parade. They also made a bunny ear hat for a family member. The picnic was well attended. The children enjoyed having lunch with family and friends.
