# **CLASS REPORT**

We would like to welcome Shanaya Chadha, Jonathan Zhang and Chloe Tan and their families to our school. They have settled in well and are learning the classroom routine.

The three-year old's have been looking at and learning about farm animals. They have made horses, geese, cows and pigs as part of their study. The craft activities have given them the opportunity to practice their fine motor skills such as pencil and scissor skills.



The four-year old's are learning about the human body. They have explored the five senses gaining some understanding of their senses. They have had opportunities to physically experience the senses tables set up in the classroom, each table highlighting a different sense.

The kindergarten children are studying about land and water forms. They have completed a book on land and water forms. They have gained a sound knowledge about many land forms such as an island, lake, bay, cape, gulf, peninsula, an isthmus and a strait. They made their own land forms with clay.



The kindergarten children have started a world book. They learn about a country each week-starting with Australia and following the alphabetical order. With this study, the children learn about the language spoken in the country, the currency used, its population, the neighbouring countries and the climate, the significance of their flag and also places of interest.

They have also begun a flag book. Children develop researching and investigating skills as they find background information regarding the flagwhich country it belongs to and its exact location within the continent.

The kindergarten children have been studying about the famous artists. They re-created a Monet art work by painting the water and adding lily pads and water lilies to complete it. They have also studied about Ken Done, an Australian artist.



They drew their own beach scene with pastels and added sand to represent the beach. Their art work was displayed on the classroom notice board. They have also looked at art work from other famous artists such as Margaret Preston who painted still life. As part of their study the Kindergarten children arranged their own vase of flowers and painted the still life vase of flowers which is on display on the classroom notice board.

The science focus for the Kindergarten children this term were colours and magnets. They learnt about primary colours, secondary colours and



neutral colours. They have conducted many experiments with mixing different colour combinations and also adding white to discover the results. The Kindergarten children experimented with magnets to find things that were magnetic conductors and which things are attracted to magnets.

The kindergarten children have been on an excursion to the Sydney Aquarium as part of their study about things that live in water. As it was the first time most students had visited the Aquarium, the excitement was infectious.

They watched the sharks swimming and a diver feeding them, the manta rays gliding above, an octopus, dugongs moving around and many other colourful fish.



They also had the opportunity to touch the star fish, sea urchins and shark eggs at the touch pool. Having lunch outside the Aquarium, the food in the lunch boxes attracted a lot of sea gulls -as usual. It was funny and scary to have a seagull come and steal one of their sandwiches. It was a very exciting and an enjoyable day. We wish to thank the parents who accompanied us on our trip to the Aquarium.

The class continues to enjoy cooking each Thursday. For the new additions to our class room it was a novel experience to learn to sieve flour, beat eggs and roll out dough. As a result of the cooking sessions, the students experience how to work collaboratively as part of a team. They learn about the ingredients that goes in to the cooking and to follow a recipe.

#### It's Easter!

We are getting ready for Easter. The students have completed many art and craft work. They have made cards, Easter baskets and completed many other fun activities. The students have decorated their own hats which they will wear for the Easter hat parade. They also made a bunny ear hat for a family member.



We are looking forward to this Friday when all the families

come together to join us at the school grounds for the Easter picnic.
