CLASSROOM ACTIVITIES

This term has seen the children discover many new things. The focus for the three year olds has been animals that live in the water. They took a look at seahorses, turtles, sharks and fish. It gave them an opportunity to discover and learn more about the creatures that live around them in their world. The information passed on to them will serve to develop their vocabulary, thinking and concepts of sea animals. This project work also aids in their fine motor development, using scissors, pencils and glue sticks.




The four year olds have been delving into the life cycle and parts of a butterfly. A popular story to accompany this learning is of course, The Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle, which a lot of children are familiar with. Looking at the different parts of any animal or insect is always interesting for the children as it gives them a chance to discover more about them.



The extended day class have been learning about the solar system and timelines of dinosaurs, humans and the planet. The children looked at their own time lines and brought in photos for every year of their life so far. It was so nice to see in photographs what each child was like as a baby and to have their growth documented in this way to the current day. Thank you to the parents for providing the pictures. The children enjoyed sharing them with their peers and teachers.



Science lessons in the extended day class have centred on magnets and conductors, electricity within our environment and electrical circuits. The class experimented with making their own static electricity and then used batteries to learn about circuits and how to make them work. Another science topic investigated this term was soluble and insoluble, carrying out experiments to understand this concept and looking also at what happens to substances when they are heated and frozen.



The children started a world book at the start of the year discovering a country in the world named after each letter of the alphabet and saw the completion of it this term. This exercise provided the children with a good opportunity to discover the world around them and look at pictures from far and wide and compare them to the life they live here in Australia.



Parent observations provided a good opportunity for the parents to be able to observe their child in the classroom after a long absence due to COVID-19. Most of the children took it in their stride and went about their activities. We hope you enjoyed your insight into what your child likes to do and the classroom in general. We thank all the parents for attending the interviews to discuss your child's progress.
